# Regulatory Issues

[Editor's Note: ANCO is a member of the Association of Community Cancer Centers (ACCC) and a state/regional affiliate of the American Society of Clinical Oncology (ASCO). We regularly participate with these organizations on matters of

national importance to oncology practices.]

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) has issued an interim final rule revising the Medicare payments for drugs and drug administration payments for 2004 as required by the recently enacted Medicare Prescription Drug, Improvement, and Modernization Act. The rule is available on the CMS website (www.cms.gov/physicians/pfs/); the GPCI adjusted amounts are available at the NHIC/Medicare website

The Association of Northern California Oncologists (ANCO) is a professional association of medical oncologists and hematologists dedicated to promoting high professional standards of oncology by providing a forum for the exchange of ideas, data, and knowledge. A list of oncology-specific drugs and their payment rates can be accessed at ASCO's website (www.asco.org/medicare) or at the CMS website (www.cms.gov/providers/ drugs). Changes are effective for dates of service beginning Thursday, January 1<sup>st</sup>. CMS estimates that Medicare revenues to oncologists from drugs will decline by \$510 million as a result of the rule and that physician fee schedule payments to oncologists will increase by the same amount.

A summary of the principal points of importance to oncology follows:

- 1. The payments for drug administration services have generally been increased.
- 2. Because each drug administration code now includes a physician work component, physicians can no longer bill a Level 1 visit on days when a patient receives chemotherapy but is not seen by the physician.
- 3. Because there is now a physician work component in the drug administration codes, physicians must use modifier -25 when a visit and a drug administration code are billed on the same day. Use of the modifier indicates that a separately identifiable evaluation and management service was provided.
- 4. CPT code 96408 (chemotherapy administration by push) can be billed once per day for each drug administered.

ASCO's *Clinical Practice Committee* (CPC) and *State/Regional Affiliates* teleconferenced on Thursday afternoon, January 8<sup>th</sup> to discuss changes in Medicare drug and practice expense reimbursement. In summary:

- ASCO is conducting an analysis of the CMS drug and practice expense reimbursement rates as well as constructing a tool for practices to use to analyze their impact.
- ASCO will submit to CMS detailed comments on the new drug and practice expense reimbursement rules.

- ASCO/MGMA are conducting a study of the impact of the new reimbursement on currently non-reimbursed service lines. The results of this study will be forwarded to CMS, *Congress*, and MedPAC.
- ASCO is considering how to contribute to the mandated MedPAC study of the impact of the legislation.
- ASCO continues to meet with the media on this issue expressing concern regarding the new law's impact on 2005 reimbursement and the need to have definitive information no later than mid-2004 for long-term planning.
- Member coding and billing questions from are being addressed and compiled as a *Frequently Asked Question* document that will become available online early next week.
- ASCO members should contribute data on drugs that will no longer be reimbursed at or above cost; on the impact of 20% co-payments on costly drugs used by Medicare beneficiaries and the bad debt this creates; on hospital outpatient referrals and how they are received by the hospital; and, on the suspension/ending of participation in clinical trials. This information will be compiled for CMS and *Congress*.
- The Clinical Practice Committee leadership would be happy teleconference with state/regional affiliate leadership/membership.

# CMA, MOASC, and State Legislative/Regulatory Issues

[Editor's Note: ANCO and the Medical Oncology Association of Southern California (MOASC) are members of the California Medical Association's (CMA) House of Delegates and Council on Legislation. ANCO and MOASC cooperate on several joint ventures and coordinate activities in the

advocacy and membership benefit arenas. Each is represented at the *Board* meeting of the other.]

U.S. District Judge David Levi granted a preliminary injunction in the lawsuit filed by CMA and other plaintiffs (and financially supported by ANCO and MOASC) to stop the 5% DHS/MediCal rate cut that was set to go into effect on January 1<sup>st</sup>.

In granting the preliminary injunction, *Judge* Levi said that the state of California failed to consider how the hundreds of millions in cuts

would affect access to care for poor, disabled, elderly and children whose health care is provided by DHS/MediCal.

"This is excellent news," said CMA CEO Jack Lewin, M.D. "Going forward, this ruling seems to thwart the current administration's additional 10 percent proposed reductions as well. The judge's decision will prevent further erosion of access to care for our most vulnerable patients."

The judge also ruled that cuts already made against DHS/MediCal managed care plans would have to be addressed separately. Attorneys for CMA and its co-plaintiffs are still reviewing what the ruling means for DHS/MediCal managed care plans (which account for about half of all DHS/MediCal recipients).


# Review of the 26<sup>th</sup> Annual San Antonio Breast Cancer Symposium

Group Purchasing Organization. The COC GPO has preferred vendor agreements and discounted pricing with *International Oncology Network* (ION) and *Oncology Supply* (OS), and with *National Oncology Alliance* (NOA) and *Oncology Therapeutics Network* (OTN) for oncology pharmaceuticals and a wide-range of value-added services.

ION reports that *Bristol-Myers Squibb Oncology* is recalling BiCNU (Lot #LKM11) because it did not meet potency specifications when held for eight hours at room temperature after reconstitution, and that *Aventis* is recalling Gammar (Lot #A631805) because it exhibits an increased frequency of non-serious, labeled adverse events of a delayed onset allergic type (principally hives and itching).

The COC continues to offer a **Zoladex Discount Program** via *AstraZeneca*. Discounts of up to 40% are possible through this program. Contact your local *AstraZeneca* urology representative for additional information.
