NHIC/Medicare & DHS/MediCal

[Editor's Note: ANCO meets with National Heritage Insurance Company (NHIC) that administers Medicare in California and the Department of Health Services (DHS) that administers MediCal in California.]

A recent *DHS/MediCal Newsletter* (August 2004, pp. 3-4) outlines a new policy and X-code (X7493) for darbepoetin. The X -code is effective for dates of service on or after September 1st. Covered diagnoses include, but are not limited to, anemia due to treatment with chemotherapeutic agents for cancer (ICD-9

codes 140.0-239.9 for neoplasms or V58.1 for chemotherapy, and 285.22 for anemia in neoplastic disease).

A new DHS/MediCal policy affecting physician office laboratories (POLs) performing moderate and high complexity tests, which include CBCs via a Coulter counter, is being implemented September 1st. Previously, DHS/MediCal has accepted CLIA certification, and the tests have been billed under the physician provider number, coupled with the E&M visit. Effective September 1st, the POL must apply for a separate clinical laboratory provider number (the application form is 30 pages long), the physician must be certified as the laboratory director, and all

testing staff must be independently credentialed. Additionally, the POL may be subject to regulatory inspection over and above CLIA.

Publications, Services, & Surveys

ANCO will be purchasing bulk copies of ASCO's *Practical Tips for the Practicing Oncologist* (3rd edition) for distribution to all member practices. There will be no need for individual member practices to purchase a copy of this book. *Practical Tips* answers the most commonly asked questions about coding,

coverage, reimbursement, and regulatory issues for medical oncology services. Watch for your copy in the Fall.

For the second consecutive year ANCO members raised their patient satisfaction survey scores and significantly outscored other practices in Sullivan/Luallin's national hematology/oncology database. A total of 37 physicians participated in the survey, to which 1,008 patients responded. Nearly all scores were above the 2003 baseline. The improvements noted in the table below take on greater significance in that specialist scores are not evenly distributed—the database ranges from a low score of 3.92 to a high score of 4.81. In this context, the upward trend is statistically significant.

The challenge for practices with high survey scores is to avoid complacency by noting that, while the results indicate improvement, the medical marketplace continues to be more competitive. Physicians in every specialty are competing for patient loyalty and referrals despite crowded schedules, more informed patients, lean staffing, and limited resources.

Practices should celebrate the high scores while identifying performance areas that can be improved prior to the next survey cycle (in 2006). One strategy would be a referring physician survey to obtain valid feedback on (a) how well your office meets the expectations of primary care doctors; and (b) what patients say about you when they return to their family physician.
