- Official DIMA information from Medicare can be accessed at www.cms.hhs.gov/mmu/default.asp.
- Patient access to care problems should be reported by patients directly to Medicare at 1-800-Medicare (in addition to www.accesswatch.org; see ANCO FAX News, Vol. 3, No.5).
- Drug reimbursement for 2005 based on Average Sales Price (ASP) is not likely to be released until the fourth quarter of 2004.
- Billing for all performed services is more important than ever.

ACCC's Center for Provider Education is pleased to announce a series of regional educational sessions entitled Life in the New Medicare Era: Coding, Billing, and Management for Medical Oncology Practices Designed for physicians, practice managers, and coders/billers, these five-hour practical and hands-on sessions will explore the primary components of oncology billing and how Medicare reform impacts this process and help oncology practices operate more efficiently and effectively. CMA, MOASC, and State Legislative/Regulatory Issues

[Editor's Note: ANCO and the Medical Oncology Association of Southern California (MOASC) are members of the California Medical Association's (CMA) House of Delegates and Council on Legislation. ANCO and MOASC cooperate on several joint ventures and coordinate activities in the advocacy and membership benefit arenas. Each is represented at the Board meeting of the other.]

State Senator Deborah Ortiz introduced Senate Joint Resolution (SJR) 25 asking Congress to correct DIMA, including its cancer care provisions, on March 8th. Currently, SJR25 is in the Senate Health and Human Services Committee. ANCO urges its members to contact their State Assemblymembers and Senators in support of SJR25.

ANCO is also actively involved (see position) with the following pieces of legislation among others:

- Opposes AB2125 (Levine) requiring a physician to indicate the patient's diagnosis on each prescription and to include this information on the container's label.
- Opposes AB2588 (Reyes) prohibiting a physician from disclosing medical information to any third-party for the purpose of medical data processing or medical record transcription.
- Opposs AB2626 (Plescia) removing the requirement of a physician to review, countersign, and date the medical records of patients cared for by a physician assistant.
- Supports AB2783 (Berg) requiring coverage for the treatment of chronic pain to continue as long as the treatment is effective.
- Supports AB2876 (Calderon) specifying that the duration of covered services for a terminal illness may exceed 12 months.

The most recent *NHIC/Medicare Medicare Advisory Forum* (MAF) meeting took place via teleconference on March 16th. Among the topics discussed were:

- Spring 2004 workshops in Northern California (see www.medicarenhic.com/cal_prov/seminars.shtml).
- Medicare's July 1st modification of its HIPAA contingency plan to allow

submission of noncompliant electronic claims but delay payment by thirteen (13) additional days.

• A change in the name, format, and

content of Local Medical Review Policies (LMRPs) to Local Coverage Determinations (LCDs). LCDs will no longer include billing information, which will be provided via website and Resource articles.

• Provider enrollment and database management updates resulting in processing delays.

The next NHIC/Medicare Advisory Forum (MAF) teleconference takes place on June 15th; the next NHIC/Medicare Carrier Advisory Committee (CAC) meeting takes place in Los Angeles on April 21st; the next ANCO•MOASC meeting with NHIC/Medicare will take place at a date and location to be determined.
