Among the highlights of the Administrators in Hematology Oncology Assembly (AOHA) Annual Meeting were:

- Deborah Kamin, Ph.D., ASCO's Senior Director of Cancer Policy & Clinical Affairs, outlining ongoing legislative activities in Washington, D.C. and emphasizing ASCO's goal of achieving reimbursement policy that will ensure patient access to high-quality care without disruption.
- José Luis González, ANCO's *Executive Director*, discussing the importance of state oncology societies in payer relations.
- Numerous sessions on how to assess and adapt to the impact of Medicare reform on your oncology practice.

ASCO's latest edition of MMA Today was published on April 1st. In summary:

- ASCO continues to meet with Congressional and CMS leadership, is developing new materials to inform Congress, and placing targeted advocacy advertisements.
- ASCO will make a presentation to CMS at their April 20th Special Listening Session addressing implementation of the competitive bidding provisions of Medicare reform.

State Senator Deborah Ortiz's Senate Joint Resolution (SJR) 25, asking Congress to correct the cancer care provisions of Medicare reform, passed the State Senate and is in the Assembly. ANCO urges its members to contact their State Assemblymembers in support of SJR25.

NHIC/Medicare & DHS/MediCal

[Editor's Note: ANCO meets with National Heritage Insurance Company (NHIC) that administers Medicare in California and the Department of Health Services (DHS) that administers MediCal in California.]

The *Medicare B Resource* (March 2004) is now available online at www.medicarenhic.com/news/provider_news/ca-mbr/04-1.pdf.

NHIC/Medicare has published a draft *Local Coverage Determination* (LCD) on its website for darbepoetin alfa (Aranesp; J0880, Q0137). Visit www.medicarenhic.com/cal_prov/lmrp/draft/darbepoetinalfa_draftlmrp.htm for complete details. In summary, the draft LCD covers Aranesp for its labeled and compendia listed indications, that is:

- Anemia of end stage renal disease (ESRD) patients requiring dialysis.
- Anemia of chronic renal failure (CRF).
- Anemia due to chemotherapy for non-myeloid malignancy.
- Anemia as a result of malignancy.

This is more restrictive than the NHIC/Medicare website article dated January 8th, 2004. In addition, the initiation point for therapy and coding/billing instructions have

been changed. The notice and comment period begins on April 21st and ends on June 4th. Please send ANCO your input for inclusion in our comments on this proposed policy.

The next NHIC/Medicare Advisory Forum (MAF) teleconference takes place on June 15th; the next NHIC/Medicare Carrier Advisory Committee (CAC) meeting takes place in Los Angeles on April 21st; the next ANCO•MOASC meeting with NHIC/Medicare will take place at a date and location to be determined.

Private Payers

ANCO members have informed us that *Blue Shield of California*, in a letter to its physician members dated March 1st, announced that it

...will be implementing changes to our professional allowances. Procedure code allowances that are based upon the RBRVS (resource-based relative value scale) methodology will align with the 2004

relativity...effective beginning April 1st...Blue Shield will be increasing drug

administration code allowances and therefore the drug code (J-code) allowances will be calculated using a nationally recognized pricing resource at current AWP less 12%...the reimbursement for any given service code will be above what you receive from CMS as we have set a higher conversion factor...

comprehensive guide to oncology billing, coding, and coverage decisions by NHIC/Medicare, DHS/MediCal, and the DMERC. For each drug (accessible by either its generic or brand name), the HCPCS J-code, DHS x-code, FDA-labeled and Compendia listed off-label (both USP-DI and AHFS) indications, and Medicare, MediCal, and DMERC coverages are provided. A username and password are required to use the *Drug Grid* and may be obtained from the ANCO office. A .pdf version of the *Drug Grid* is also available for download. ANCO acknowledges the permission of MOASC for allowing distribution of this information to ANCO members.
