The second enrollment period began on February 15<sup>th</sup> and will run for 45 days.

In the previous issue of the ANCO FAX News, it was reported that according to a summary of CMS's Open Door Forum on MedicareRx prepared by the Lash Group Healthcare Consultants (an ANCO Corporate Member), it is CMS policy that:

• Part D plans cannot pay for drugs covered by Part B.

Actually, PDPs may list Part B drugs. Therefore, some drugs may be paid for by either Part D or Part B, depending on the site of acquisition and administration.

ASCO and the *National Coalition for Cancer Survivorship* (NCCS) recently announced the formation of the *Cancer Quality Alliance*, a forum for diverse stakeholders in the cancer community whose mission is to improve the quality of care provided to people with cancer. Leaders from ASCO and NCCS will co-chair the *Alliance* which will work to foster collaboration among organizations in the cancer community that are committed to

cancer care quality improvement and seek to eliminate unnecessary duplication.

# CMA, MOASC, and State Legislative/Regulatory Issues

[Editor's Note: ANCO and the Medical Oncology Association of Southern California (MOASC) are members of the California Medical Association's (CMA) House of Delegates and Council on Legislation. ANCO and MOASC cooperate on several joint ventures and coordinate activities in the advocacy and membership benefit arenas. Each is represented at the Board meeting of the other.]

Noteware Government Relations represents ANCO (and MOASC) in Sacramento. They report:

• In 2003, Governor Gray Davis's administration authored and signed a bill that reduced MediCal provider rates by 5%. After legal attempts to reverse the rate cut failed, SB912 was introduced this year in the California Legislature. SB912, sponsored by CMA and supported by ANCO, permanently eliminated the rate cut. The bill received bi-partisan support in the Senate and Assembly, was signed by Governor Schwarzenegger, and contained an urgency clause that allows it to go into effect immediately.

AB651 (*California's Compassionate Choices Act*) is modeled on the Oregon law that legalized physician-assisted suicide. Last year, ANCO led the opposition to this legislation. ANCO recently sent a survey and background material to all physician members asking:
