ACCC, ASCO, ASH, and National Legislative & Regulatory Issues

[Editor's Note: ANCO is a member of the Association of Community Cancer Centers (ACCC) and a state/regional affiliate of the American Society of Clinical Oncology (ASCO).

ANCO and the American Society of Hematology (ASH) have

agreed to share information with members. We regularly participate with these organizations on matters of national importance to oncology practices.]

Senator Arlen Spector has introduced S2340, the Community Cancer Care Preservation Act of 2006. This legislation would:

- fix critical aspects of ASP;
- pay for pharmacy facilities;
- reinstitute the 2005 oncology demonstration project at the \$300M

ANCO and ASCO continue to work towards ensuring that people with cancer have access to quality cancer care in the community. Here are resources available to practices:

- The updated 2006 *Medicare Physician Fee Schedule* for California is available at www.medicarenhic.com/cal_prov/ fee_sched.shtml#60. As a result of the *Deficit Reduction Act*, and the revision to the 2006 physician update, CMS is offering a second enrollment period for physicians to reconsider their decisions in light of the revised 0 percent update. The second enrollment period ends March 31st. Changes made during this new enrollment period will be retroactive to January 1st.
- Medicare allowables for the new CPT 5-digit drug administration codes may have changed. Some are higher and some are lower. According to NHIC/Medicare,

only the conversion factor was kept at the 2005 level. However, if RVU's for a CPT code changed, they remained changed. Similarly, according to ASCO, the 3% transitional increase on drug administration codes for 2005 does not exist in 2006. Even though there is a freeze of the conversion factor, the 3% decrease will still be in effect for the drug administration services. In summary, practices should compare last year's allowables with the updated 2006 allowables to determine the bottom line impact on physician fee schedule reimbursement.

All ANCO member practices are invited and encouraged to participate in the ASCO/AOHA *Support Services Study*. It is critical that as many practices as possible participate in this *Study* that:

- Will be used to help ensure proper reimbursement for supportive services and potentially contribute to the development of new billing codes related to these services. Participation in this *Study* by as many practices as possible is essential.
- Does not request any detailed financial data. The only financial information that is requested is a breakdown of payer mix.
- Will keep practice data completely confidential.
- Will take some time to complete. Practices who need help or have questions along the way should feel free to call Stephanie Cameron at the *Lewin Group*.

The American Society of Hematology (ASH) recently hosted a focus group of hematology/oncology state societies at which ANCO participated. One of the items that came out of that meeting was sharing of information on regulatory issues. For example:

• The April 2006 Relative-Value Update Committee (RUC) may consider codes that describe physician monitoring/management of patients on anticoagulant (warfarin) therapy. Physicians who provide these services and who are willing to participate in a RUC survey related to the services should contact the ANCO office as soon as possible.

Medicare Prescription Drug Plan (PDPs; MedicareRx; Part D) coverage was effective January 1st. Medicare beneficiaries who are interested in obtaining more information about enrollment, coverage, and more details should contact 800-Medicare (or 800-633-4227), the *Health Insurance Counseling and Advocacy Program* (HICAP) at (800) 434-0222, or visit www.medicare.gov. CMA, MOASC, and State Legislative/Regulatory Issues

[Editor's Note: ANCO and the Medical Oncology Association of Southern California (MOASC) are members of the California Medical Association's (CMA) House of Delegates and Council on Legislation. ANCO and MOASC cooperate on several joint ventures and coordinate activities in the advocacy and membership benefit arenas. Each is represented at the Board meeting of the other.]

Noteware Government Relations represents ANCO (and MOASC) in Sacramento. They report:

• Last year, the California Radiological Society (CRS) sponsored AB561 that would have limited the ability of physicians, other than radiologists, to use diagnostic imaging machines in their offices. This bill was opposed by ANCO and died without a hearing. This year, CRS is sponsoring AB2805 that would prohibit a physician from having a CT, PET, or MRI diagnostic imaging machine in their office that is not owned or leased less than full-time. The bill's proponents argue they are attempting to mitigate fraud by making it more difficult for physicians to use the equipment as a "cash cow" and arguing that some physicians who lease the imaging devices less than full-time "pay per click" and then charge the health plans or the state for more than they paid for the "click." The bill has not yet been set for hearing and ANCO has not yet taken a position on this bill.

ANCO and MOASC have formed the *California Oncology Political Action Committee* or CalCancerPAC. ANCO launched fund-raising efforts for CalCancerPAC in December 2005 with its membership dues renewal. CalCancerPAC's goal is to support candidates sensitive to the needs of oncologists and their patients in California.

CMA is cosponsoring the *Healthcare Information and Management Systems Society's* conference entitled *Physicians Adopting Computer Technology* on March 25th at the *San Francisco Airport Marriot*. Attendees will receive step-by-step guidance on selecting and implementing electronic medical records. Visit www.calphys.org/html/cc057.asp for more information.

CMA's 32nd Annual Legislative Leadership Conference is April 4th at the Sheraton Grand Hotel in Sacramento. This conference provides physicians with a unique opportunity to learn about issues that affect the practice of medicine in California. As always, the day's schedule includes time for physicians to meet face to face with their legislators for frank discussions of state and local health care issues. AB487 requires all physicians renewing their license through 2006 to complete twelve (12) hours of pain medicine and end-of-life care continuing medical education (CME). CMA's Pain, Palliation, and Politics: Pain Management and End-of-Life Care in California's Regulatory Environment takes place next in San Francisco in September 2006. NHIC/Medicare & DHS/MediCal

[Editor's Note: ANCO meets with National Heritage Insurance Company (NHIC) that administers Medicare in California and the Department of Health Services (DHS) that administers MediCal in California.]

CMA recently learned that NHIC/Medicare has begun reprocessing Medicare claims paid under the old 2006 fee schedule. Physicians should not resubmit claims. NHIC/Medicare will automatically make retroactive payments for eligible claims. It may, however, take a few months to reprocess all the claims. The oldest claims will be processed first.

United Government Services (UGS), the Medicare Part A fiscal intermediary for California, has formulated a new draft Local Coverage Determination (LCD) for darbepoetin alfa. The draft LCD is open for comment through March 17th. It may be viewed at www.ugsmedicare.com/providers/lmrp/DraftIndex.asp.

Private Payers

ANCO is aware of Blue Cross/Blue Shield claims processing problems and decreased reimbursement. The ANCO Board of *Directors* has decided to bring the claims processing problems to the attention of the California Medical Association for action in light of their recent RICO legislation and attention to prompt pay regulation. However, given anti-trust restrictions, ANCO cannot intervene on behalf of member practices with regard to contractually negotiated reimbursement. Members are urged to carefully analyze any and all changes to their contractual reimbursement for professional services and drugs in the context of their current and projected practice costs.
