The Office of Inspector General (OIG) recently released a report challenging how CMS calculates ASP for multiple source Part B drugs. The report suggests that overpayment has exceeded underpayment for cancer drugs under the new system. CMS did not agree with the OIG's findings. The OIG's findings are likely to draw attention from *Congress*. ASCO is reviewing this report and will be communicating concerns about it to *Congress* and CMS.

# CMA, MOASC, and State Legislative/Regulatory Issues

[Editor's Note: ANCO and the Medical Oncology Association of Southern California (MOASC) are members of the California Medical Association's (CMA) House of Delegates and Council on Legislation. ANCO and MOASC cooperate on several joint ventures and coordinate activities in the advocacy and membership benefit arenas. Each is represented at the Board meeting of the other.]

#### *Noteware Government Relations* represents ANCO (and MOASC) in Sacramento. They report:

• CMA has sponsored a bill, authored by Assembly Members Lieu and Nakanishi, which would prohibit a physician from participating in an execution. The bill says a physician may not prescribe, administer, or supervise the administration of a medication or other substance that is part of the execution; monitor vital signs; attend or observe an execution; or, determine the point at which the inmate died. However, the bill would allow a physician to complete the death certificate, witness an execution in a nonprofessional capacity, and relieve the suffering of an inmate prior to the execution at the request of the inmate. The bill has not yet been heard in a legislative committee.

ANCO and MOASC have formed the *California Oncology Political Action Committee* or CalCancerPAC. ANCO launched fund-raising efforts for CalCancerPAC in December 2005 with its membership dues renewal. CalCancerPAC's

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goal is to support candidates sensitive to the needs of oncologists and their patients in California.

Physician office laboratories (POLs) established on or after January 1<sup>st</sup>, 1996, must be either licensed by or registered with the California Department of Health Services, subjecting them to fees and regulations beyond those currently imposed under the Federal Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments (CLIA) program. Laboratories that perform only "waived" tests (classified by FDA or CDC to be so simple that there is little risk of error) and labs that perform only "provider-performed microscopy" tests will be exempt from the State licensure requirements, but will have to register with the State. Download DHS's memorandum entitled Clinical Laboratories Oversight Program and FAQs at www.anco-online.org/advocacy.html or visit www.dhs.ca.gov/ps/ls/lfsb/default.htm. Laboratories that are not in compliance will have their Federal CLIA laboratory certificates terminated. Without a CLIA certificate, laboratories will not be able to receive Medicare or Medicaid payments. CMA is currently sponsoring a bill (AB 2452) that would suspend State licensure/registration requirements until a Federal CLIA waiver is obtained. In the meantime, however, laboratories must comply with the new regulations.

# NHIC/Medicare & DHS/MediCal

[Editor's Note: ANCO meets with National Heritage Insurance Company (NHIC) that administers Medicare in California and the Department of Health Services (DHS) that administers MediCal in California.]

CMA recently learned that NHIC/Medicare has begun reprocessing Medicare claims paid under the old 2006 fee schedule. Physicians should not resubmit claims. NHIC/Medicare will automatically make retroactive payments for eligible claims. It may, however, take a few months to reprocess all the claims. The oldest claims will be processed first.

Beginning in April 2006, Medicare physicians will be given an opportunity to elect to participate in the *Competitive Acquisition Program* (CAP) on an annual basis on or after July 1<sup>st</sup>. Participating CAP providers will obtain Medicare Part B covered drugs from selected drug categories through the CAP. Physicians who elect to participate in CAP will continue to bill their local carrier for drug administration. NHIC/Medicare has posted an article on CAP at www.medicarenhic.com/providers/articles/ capdrugbill\_0306.htm.

Beginning June 1, 2006, the SPR received through the mail will no longer be available to providers/suppliers who also receive an ERA, whether the ERA is received directly or through a billing agent, clearing house, or other entity

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representing a provider/supplier. In response to the provider/supplier communities continued need for SPRs, CMS has developed free software called Medicare Remit Easy Print (MREP) that gives providers/suppliers a tool to read and print a remittance advice (RA) from the HIPAA compliant Health Care Claim Payment/Advice (835) file. The MREP software was designed to incorporate new functionality to save providers/suppliers time and money. The paper output generated by MREP is similar to the SPR format. CMS has worked with other payers to insure their acceptance of the SPR generated by the MREP software for Coordination of Benefit claim submission. The most recent *NHIC/Medicare Medicare Advisory Forum* (MAF) teleconference took place on March 15<sup>th</sup>. While no oncology-specific agenda items were discussed, those items discussed most relevant to oncology were:

- Deficit Reduction Act (DRA) mass adjustments are beginning.
- Recent Webinars focused on the CCI edits and bundling modifiers.
- Publication of an article on duplicate claims submissions is forthcoming.

United Government Services (UGS), the Medicare Part A fiscal intermediary for California, has formulated a new draft Local Coverage Determination (LCD) for darbepoetin alfa. The draft LCD may be viewed at www.ugsmedicare.com/providers/lmrp/ DraftIndex.asp. ANCO provided the following comments to UGS: • Generally, it is ANCO's request that any Medicare Part A LCD for darbepoetin alfa be equivalent to the any corresponding Medicare Part B LCD or coverage policy. NHIC/Medicare's general LCD on erythropoetin covers darbepoetin and we would recommend that UGS adopt NHIC/Medicare's coverage criteria for darbepoetin. Our rationale is that NHIC/Medicare has already done the due diligence with regard to this agent, that NHIC/Medicare has not found any overutilization or inappropriate utilization for erythropoetin, and that it would be unfair to patients and an unreasonable burden on physicians to have two different coverage criteria cover a drug used by patients that might move between the two treatment settings.

• Specifically, the ANCO *Board* recommends:

1. Anemia of chronic disease should be listed as a covered diagnosis.

2. Anemia due to cancer (independent of treatment side effects of chemotherapy) should be listed as a covered diagnosis.

3. The need for the ferritin level to be maintained above 100mg/dl is unreasonable so long as the baseline ferritin levels do not suggest iron deficiency. Additional ferritin testing is not needed unless patients do not respond to darbepoetin and would add unnecessary additional cost without clinical significance.

4. Providers should not be faulted for dose adjustments that are less than 25%.

5. The initiation point of therapy should be Hb<12.

6. There is no clinical justification for requiring that chemotherapy must have been administered less than six months prior to initiation of erythropoetin therapy.

DHS/MediCal has approved coverage of bortezomib (.1mg; J9041) for the treatment of refractive multiple myeloma effective April 1<sup>st</sup>. J9041 is reimbursed when billed in conjunction with ICD-9 codes 202.80 and 203.00 and CPT code 96408.

# Private Payers

ANCO is aware of Blue Cross/Blue Shield claims processing problems and decreased reimbursement. The ANCO *Board of Directors* has decided to bring the claims processing problems to the attention of the *California Medical Association* for action in light of their previous successful efforts with regard to hassle factors, RICO litigation, and prompt pay regulation. In an e-mail to CMA, ANCO wrote:

...[ANCO and MOASC members have] recently brought numerous claims processing and reimbursement payer issues for oncology vis-a-vis Blue Cross/Blue Shield to our attention. Most of these issues can be put in the "hassle factor" category. The purpose of this email is to bring these issues to the attention of the *California Medical Association*—given its interest in and actions regarding hassle factors, RICO settlement, and prompt pay regulation—and to ask what assistance CMA might offer ANCO in resolving these issues.

In summary, ANCO received input on the following hassle factors in the processing of oncology claims:

• frequent requests for medical records.

• repeated requests for medical records.

• delayed reimbursement due to multiple requests for medical records.

• requests for medical records for preauthorized services.

• denials for services that do not require preauthorization due to lack of preauthorization.

• refusal to provide required/requested preauthorization.

• contradictory information provided by customer service representatives.

In summary, ANCO received the following input on **reduced reimbursement**:

- reimbursement will change on May 1<sup>st</sup>.
- drugs are being reimbursed at ASP + 10%.
- specific fee schedules are not readily available.
- delayed adoption of CPT 2006.

However, ANCO and MOASC members must understand that, given anti-trust restrictions that govern what ANCO (and MOASC) can collectively do on behalf of its membership, ANCO cannot intervene on behalf of member practices with regard to individually contracted and negotiated reimbursement. Members are urged to carefully analyze any and all changes to their contractual reimbursement for professional services and drugs in the context of their current and projected practice costs.
